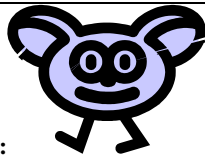
UNITY PURPOSE:

They told me I also suffered from a spiritual malady which was my anger, resentments, selfishness, self pity, fears and jealousy. Like I said, I was out of control. I would spend my rent money, I stopped paying bills. I got fired from jobs, lost friends and families. When the money ran out, I would sell things out of my house, and then break into your house. I would shoplift, sell food stamps, prostitute, do things I said I would never do. I always found myself saying this is the last time. I would go to jail, detox, treatment centers, and Western Missouri. They told me the last place was death. The 12X12 calls it a double edge sword. I was powerless. They told me that the cure they knew was complete abstinence and that this was the only step I had to take 100% and to keep coming back and that a power greater than myself would help me to get of the merry go round.

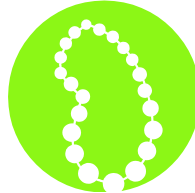

The 12 & 12 refers to crackpots, fallen women, queers, thieves, etc and if our membership was based on us not falling into any of those categories, I would be excluded at the rate of close to 100%. I do believe that some responsibility comes with membership, and particularly if you are working the twelve steps, the natural result is that you will want to give back. I do know that people's situations are all different and I am grateful for the opportunity to give back in any way possible. It is impossible to put a price on my sobriety, and what God and this fellowship and program have given me, and everything I do is miniscule in comparison to what I have received.
