

The Greater Saint Louis District Central Service meeting is held the first Sunday of each month at 4:30 PM at *New Horizon Church*, 206 Emerling in Saint Louis, Missouri 63121. If the first Sunday falls on a holiday weekend, this meeting is held the second Sunday. Confirmed meeting dates are always available on our website *www.camissouri.org*. Directions—church is located just north of Highway 70, between Florissant & Hanley Roads—Use Florissant exit—Emerling is first side street on the left (across from fuel station).

The Hospitals & Institutions Committee takes meetings into facilities where addicts cannot get out to attend a meeting on their own. H & I volunteers meet at 3:00 PM the same day and location as the District Central Service meeting (see last paragraph).

RECIPE FOR A GREAT YEAR
