

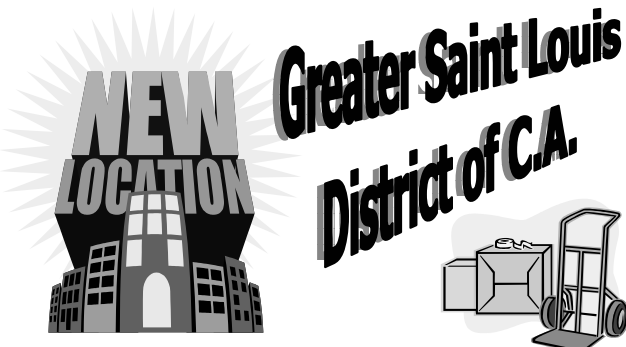

After investigating several alternatives, we discovered that the 212 Club in O'Fallon, Missouri not only had the best price, but also the most inviting space for us to meet each month and store our District files and literature cabinets.

Beginning with the District meeting on February 13 and going forward, our trusted servants (see elections article this page→) will convene monthly at the 212 Club, 204 West Pitman in O'Fallon to conduct CA business, starting with the 3 PM Hospitals & Institutions Committee meeting and following with the 4:30 PM Greater Saint Louis District business meeting. Typically this meeting is held on the first Sunday of each month, but whenever a holiday weekend falls during that first Sunday, the meeting is pushed back to the second Sunday. February's Super Bowl game precluded this month's date change.

Scotch Doubles Blind Draw

BOWLING EVENT



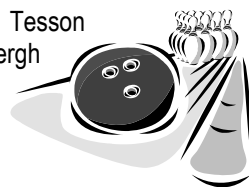
Do you like to bowl? This is a FUN event that we hope will generate some \$\$ for our local C.A. Saint Louis District. Cost to participate is \$10. For that amount, you get to bowl four games and bowling shoes will be provided if you need them. How it works is that all the bowlers' names are shuffled and teams of two players are drawn at random. You and your partner will bowl your four games together as one unit—with one of you throwing the first ball in each frame and the other person attempting to pick up the spare with the second ball. Partners will take turns bowling the first or second ball for the entire game, so each person will get two games bowling the first ball and two games bowling the second ball. Your bowling score as a team for each of the four games will be added together (no handicaps), and the four teams who have the highest total scores will win some very nice non-cash prizes. You do NOT have to be a good bowler to play—the blind draw system gives you a chance to be teamed with a partner who might be a very good bowler—but it's really not about the winning—it's about having fun and spending an afternoon with your pals in recovery. PLEASE NOTE—in order to participate you must be signed up to bowl no later than 1:15 PM and you must be able to stay and complete all four games with your partner.

In addition to the bowling, we'll be staging a cup raffle with some fabulous merchandise you can win. You choose where to place your raffle tickets on sale two for \$1 or twelve for \$5 to win the various prizes being offered. Plus a 50/50 raffle for cash will also take place.

Last, but not least, we'll also have a bake sale. ***If you can, please bring a donation of some kind of dessert item for us to sell***—it can be homemade or store bought.

So even if you decide not to bowl, there's plenty of fun to be had. Come out and join us at Concord Lanes, 11801 Tesson Ferry Road, Saint Louis 63128 (South County).
