Do you remember your first 12 step convention? Of course you do! Mine was the South Bay Round-Up in Redondo Beach, California. I was about four months clean and sober when my sponsor told me she was going to this locally-staged event and asked if I would like to join her. Being in the habit of following any of her suggestions (she hadn't steered me wrong yet!), I automatically said yes (hear that new sponsees out there?). Had no idea what to expect, but on Friday night when we walked into the opening meeting ballroom at the hotel, I started to get "the rush." As addicts, we all know what that means—however, this was the first time I had ever felt it WITHOUT any drugs or alcohol in my system. I was instantly hooked. The room was full (at least 1,500 in attendance) of happy, laughing, bright-eyed, alive people. I definitely wanted what they had. The out-of-town speaker, while hilarious in his pitch, also managed to deliver a moving and powerful testimony of how the program had changed his life irrevocably for the best. The clincher for me came at the end when we all joined hands and said the Lord's prayer. I could literally feel the group's spiritual energy coursing through my body via hundreds of conduit hands joined as one. More please!

Since that time, I've attended scores of conventions, both large and small, some of which I've even had the privilege of serving on the organizing committees. Yet to be disappointed in any of these events, I view each one as a mega-fix of recovery that boosts my personal program enormously. For a fraction of the cost we used to squander on our drugs, we can hear circuit speakers, take workshops, blitz marathon meetings around the clock, and participate in a plethora of fun sober social activities ranging from dances to comedy shows to pool parties. Why would anyone want to miss out?

Space does not permit me to wax on about the countless convention miracles to which I've been privy. I do have to mention just a couple of the more profound recollections though. At my third or fourth convention, I finally heard a woman tell "my story" from the podium. Harriet R. was sober for 30 odd years when I heard her talk in Bakersfield, California. I was still wet behind the ears in sobriety, but had been around long enough to recognize the resonating vibes in my heart as I heard this lovely lady describe my feelings and actions to a T. Enthralled, I cornered her afterwards to convey what a strong impact her story had made for me. She lived in Florida and I (at that time) in California, but she graciously gave me her address and phone number. For the next 15 years until she passed away, we corresponded regularly. Harriet shared so much of her experience, strength and hope with me. She enriched my recovery with her genuine delight at "adopting" this cocky, young newcomer and helping to mold my thinking into a healthy, acceptance-based perception. A priceless gift I can only repay by passing it forward.

In the year 2000, my husband and I finally made it to our first international convention. Remember the impression made upon me by the closing prayer at the South Bay Round-Up (described in the first paragraph of this article)? Well, imagine that times about 50 with a stadium full of 65,000 recovering addicts/alcoholics observing a moment of silence (you could hear a pin drop!) followed by the Lord's prayer. Talk about electric! I will never forget how that felt—touching me spiritually to the core of my being. The ultimate rush! Again, more please!

I am rarely without a convention speaker CD in my car. Nowadays you can download 12 step convention talks for free to your phone or computer. Keeping me constantly inspired, I never tire of listening to these personal stories, connecting me on a daily basis to God and my program.
