Spring, for thousands of years, has meant rebirth of the earth's bounty. Warmer temperatures and longer days have a positive impact on our feeling of well-being. Making a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves, as stated in Step Four, may be perceived as a new beginning, if we have the courage to be honest with ourselves. We are challenged to accept what we discover and to make space for a new way of living.

Spring brings a sense of optimism we can all tap into and use for our benefit. However, with three years of the Covid-19 pandemic and when the dreary dark and cold winter changes into the bright and breezy spring, addiction triggers can emerge. The C.A. brochure, *Tools of Recovery*, outlines the strategy needed to maintain sobriety: **Abstinence** from all mind-altering substances is the first thing we must practice. Stay connected by attending **Meetings** to share our experience, strength, and hope with other recovering addicts. When it comes to **Literature**, we use the *Big Book* and the

Twelve and Twelve of Alcoholics Anonymous because it has already been proven that the Twelve-Step recovery program works. We also use *Hope, Faith & Courage: Stories from the Fellowship of Cocaine Anonymous*, *A Quiet Peace: Daily Meditations*, and most recently, the *C.A. Twelve-Step Companion Guide*. Staying connected with our **Sponsor** gives access to support and accountability, which includes scheduling regular sessions to work the **Steps**, and preparing ourselves to be able to help other addicts. Our **Higher Power** keeps us grounded in the reality that the God of our understanding is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves. Getting involved in **Service Work** helps us by helping others while promoting our primary purpose to help the addict who still suffers. The **Telephone** is our lifeline to stay in touch with our sponsor and C.A. members, and to use it before making the mistake of losing our sobriety. Recognizing that our continued sobriety is achieved A Day at A Time can be maintained with daily **Prayer and Meditation**. Let us all remember that our primary purpose is to stay free from cocaine and all other mind-altering substances, and to help others achieve the same freedom.

February 1st, 2023 Dear Trusted Servants,

The World Service Office Board of Directors, after study and thoughtful consideration has found it necessary to increase some of our prices on plastic/key tag chips and pamphlets.

Inflation has caught up with CAWSO. Our costs for everything at World Services have been going up.

In order to pay our staff livable wages, pay higher utilities, as well as fuel surcharges on some of our shipping, we need to raise our prices after many years of no increases. The cost of paper prior to the pandemic had skyrocketed yet we held prices down.

So, we are sad to say we must raise our prices on pamphlets from 35 cents to 50 cents and our plastic chips will change from 45 cents to 60 cents effective March 1, 2023. We understand this may cause a burden on our smaller groups and we are sensitive to these effects. We have been working with our vendors and are making progress in shortening the wait time on our restocking orders from our suppliers.

The WSO staff has been working diligently to fill the back orders while increasing order accuracy and shortening wait time on regular orders. We are training staff on improving our ordering and trace systems.

Thank you for your patience and understanding.
