That's what I felt after receiving the tubs of items as the newly elected Archives Chair for the Greater Missouri Area of C.A. Believing my task was to simply put this "stuff" in order, *I came to believe* that was easier said than done. While opening tubs, it was clear that this was more than categorizing paper documents. There are cups, old programs, manuals, hats - it seemed to go on ad infinitum! I needed help!

Going through one of the tubs, I came across an old 2007 World Service Conference Service Manual. Flipping through the manual, I came across the CAWS Archives Committee Guidelines. *Suddenly*, the thought came where to get the guidance I needed when looking over the guidelines:

These records establish and maintain our identity as a Cocaine Anonymous members and tell us stories to help us to understand of our fellowship, both locally and globally—focusing our C.A. identity and facilitating C.A. 
